

## A workshop for Ideation and Problem-Solving skills

### Report on a workshop for Ideation and Problem-Solving skills

On 26<sup>th</sup> April 2024, COEI in collaboration with E-Cell of Sathaye College Autonomous and PTVAIM'S IIC organized a workshop on ideation and Problem Solving skills from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm for the students of Sathaye College. There were 48 participants attending the workshop. The workshop commenced with an introduction of the Main Facilitator, Mrs. Sukruta Pethe. She is a In-charge at COEI and an Assistant Professor at the Sathaye College Autonomous. Mrs. Sukruta Pethe began the workshop with an introduction to the concept of Ideation and how to notice the problems around them. Concepts were explained via audio-visuals and real life examples were used to make it exciting. She taught the students how to turn problems into solutions. To help the audience thoroughly understand the concepts, they were engaged with some entertaining and educational exercises. She compared the problem solvers to superheroes making the lives of others easier. The workshop concluded with an explanation of the link between creativity and problem-solving, and how problems noticed can be used to build an adequate solution. A minor idea brainstorming session was taken where the students created the solutions of their problems. Later, A short Q&A session was conducted to wipe away any doubts the audience must have had, with each question being handled in simple language and in great detail. Lastly, Mrs. Sukruta Pethe was presented with applause for the workshop by the audience.
