



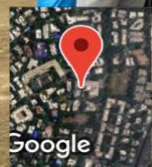

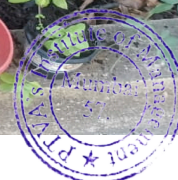

Composting Do's and Don'ts

Do's

- Do Start on Bare Earth or Ventilated Bin.
- Add yard and garden residues and other organic materials to the compost pile, including leaves, grass clippings, straw and hay, sawdust, and finely chopped or shred tree and shrub pruning's.
- Build the compost piles in layers of plant material with a one-inch layer of soil or previously made compost in between.
- Add a combination of green and brown plant material. The green provides the Nitrogen, and the brown adds the Carbon. Both are necessary for the microbes that break down the organic material.
- Shred or cut large items before adding them to the compost pile, such as branches and twigs, newspaper, etc.
- Add food scraps from produce items, such as apple cores, banana and orange peels, melon rinds, etc. You can also add coffee grounds and eggshells on your compost pile.
- Add water occasionally if it doesn't rain, so the pile is damp, but not soggy.
- Have patience. It will take two to four months for plant material in a compost pile to decompose if it is turned regularly.

Don'ts

- Don't leave the compost bin uncovered.
- Do not add certain food scraps like fish, meat, dairy products, bones, baked goods, fatty foods, or grease to your compost pile.
- Don't let the compost get too Wet or Dry
- Avoid chemicals at all costs.
- Avoid Plastic waste such as bottles, wrappers etc.
- Avoid adding Glass Materials.
- Don't add diseased plant materials or weeds that have gone to seed.



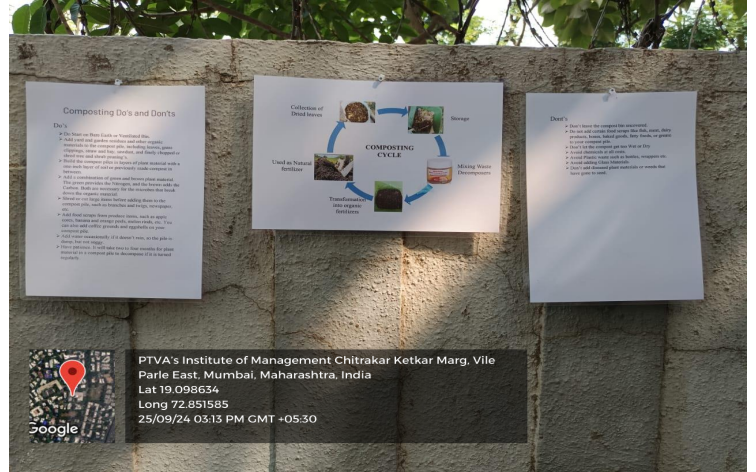

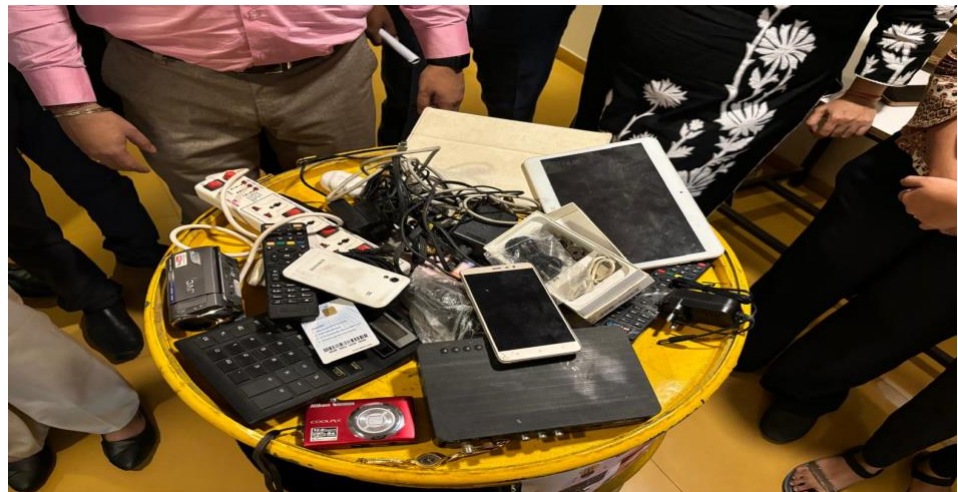

1) Purpose of Collaboration

- i) Both parties recognize the environmental impact of plastic waste and the importance of promoting sustainable practices.
- ii) PTVAIM is an educational Institute, where students are sensitized about environmental issues.
- iii) Collaborating with PTVAIM shall allow Aakar Mumbai to conduct sensitization drives in the areas of environmental sustainability.

2) Areas of Cooperation

- i) PTVAIM shall dedicate a space within the premises to place a bin that shall be used by the students, staff, and members of the local community to deposit their recyclable plastic waste.
- ii) If the PTVAIM collects monthly minimum of 25kg of dry waste in a month, a vehicle shall be sent to by Aakar Mumbai to collect this dry waste including recyclable plastic. In case the dry waste

- including recyclable plastic collected by PTVAIM is less than 25 kg, PTVAIM shall send a representative to Aakar Mumbai to drop dry waste including recyclable plastic.
- iii) After 1 year of the successful completion of this collaboration, the certificate shall be issued by the Aakar Mumbai to PTVAIM to that effect.
 - iv) Aakar Mumbai shall organize field visits to their recycling facilities for hands on experience for students of PTVAIM.
 - v) Aakar Mumbai shall organize awareness campaigns on plastic pollution and plastic recycling for the students of PTVAIM at PTVAIM premises free of charge.
 - vi) A few of MMS Semester IV students of PTVAIM shall work with Aakar Mumbai for a period of three weeks to complete their Social Relevance Project which is a requirement as per the syllabus of the University of Mumbai without expecting any stipend in lieu of the work. Aakar Mumbai shall issue a Certificate of Internship to these students.

3) Tenure

This MOU shall come in effect from the date of affixing signature by both the Parties and shall remain valid for a period of three (03) years from that date.


4) Financials

In this agreement EFI and PARTY shall jointly setup E-Waste Collection Bin in the PARTY's premises. Once the bin is filled with E-Waste the responsible person shall contact EFI, afterwhich EFI shall collect the E-Waste and dispose it as per the MPCB/CPCB guidelines.

NOTE: It shall be noted that the installation fee of a collection bin is Free /- (in words).

TERMS OF CONTRACT

Responsibilities of PARTY

1. ~~INVESTMENT: PARTY shall have to pay a one time installation fee for the collection bin from EFI (NOTE: It shall be noted that the cost of a collection bin is Rs. 10,000/-)~~ *MM*
2. PARTY shall provide 10sqft area of Property for setting up Collection Point at the mutually agreed location.
3. PARTY shall take responsibility that NO HAZARDOUS Material (Other than E-Waste) is added into the collection point.
4. When the Collection bin gets full the authorized person of PARTY must inform EFI for the collection of the material.
5. PARTY must protect the Bin against thieves, vandalizes.
6. PARTY need NOT pay EFI any disposal charges or collection fees of the E-Waste generated from the Bin.

Responsibilities of Eco Friend Industries

1. It shall be noted that the Collection bin is the property of EFI.
2. EFI shall renew all its licenses and legal requirements as per the law of land.
3. EFI shall collect E-Waste promptly, within 72 hrs, as and when informed by PARTY's authorized person.
4. E-Waste shall be segregated, loaded and transported to EFI E-Waste Facility Navi Mumbai.
5. E-Waste shall be handled and disposed as per guidelines and directives of E-Waste management and handling rules and MPCB/CPCB.
6. EFI shall not charge PARTY for the Collection, Transportation, Handling, Management, Recycling and Disposal of E-Waste Generated at the Collection Bin.
7. All authorized material collected, as E-Waste from the Collection Point shall be the property of EFI.
8. E-Waste Material generated from the bin cannot be disposed, traded or sold to any other service provider or Bhangarwala or another E-Waste solution provider.
9. There shall not be any monetary exchange with EFI for E-Waste material collected.
10. EFI shall procure all necessary insurance for risks that may arise in the process of transportation of E-Waste from Collection Bins to EFI's facility.
11. EFI shall have sole right over any revenue (Advertising, Marketing, Promotional, Creative, Any Other) that may be generated from the bin.
12. EFI shall not charge any Transportation / Freight for the E-Waste that will be collected from the Collection Bin.
13. EFI shall not charge any Labour Expense for the E-Waste that will be collected from the Collection Bin.
14. EFI shall issue PARTY
 - a. Green certificate of Disposal
 - b. Form 6 (Manifest Copy)
 - c. Photocopy of the entry of disposal in CPCB registration Pass book

2. PARTY/EFI shall make all promotion and awareness activity to the best of their abilities for the success of our project.

DURATION

1. The term of this Agreement will commence on the date of signing this Agreement and, unless earlier terminated as provided herein, will continue for Ten Years (10 Years).
2. Either Party may terminate this Agreement immediately on written notice at any time the other Party commits any irremediable material breach of this Agreement or for the avoidance of doubt, but without limitation, commits any remediable breach of this Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within a period of thirty (30) days from the service on it of a notice specifying the breach and requiring it to be remedied or, having so remedied.
3. Either Party may terminate this Agreement, if a petition or application for winding up of the other Party has been admitted and a liquidator has been appointed or an order of bankruptcy or winding up or dissolution has been passed by competent courts.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Each Party shall keep this Agreement and all related information and correspondence provided to the other Party in strict confidence, and shall not disclose the same to any third party, except if required to be disclosed under Applicable Laws. For the purpose of this clause, Parties may enter into an appropriate confidentiality agreement.

FORCE MAJEURE

1. Force Majeure means any event or a combination of event that materially or adversely affect the performance of either Parties of its obligation ("Affected Party") of its obligations in whole or in part, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement but only to the extent that such event or circumstances are not within the Affected Party's reasonable control and have not been caused by willful neglect or act or omission of the Affected Party. The following events shall constitute Force Majeure: epidemic, nuclear emergency, earthquake, riot, war, acts of terrorist.
2. In the event Force Majeure continues unabated for an uninterrupted period of 30 days either Party has a right to terminate this Agreement by providing prior written notice.

GOVERNING LAW & COURT OF JURISDICTION

The E-Waste Collection Agreement shall be governed by Law applicable in the state of India and Courts situated at Mumbai, Maharashtra will have exclusive jurisdiction in any matter arising out the contract.
