

**29<sup>th</sup> APRIL 2022 Session on 'Important aspects to consider while preparing patent specifications' by Dr. Dinesh P Patil, Dy. Controller of Patents and Design**

**Objective:** To inform about the processes, the technical aspects involving for consideration while preparing patent application.

**Benefits:** The speaker briefly explained the process for applying for patent, patent specifications and different objectives to consider while applying for a patent.

**Report on Session on 'Important aspects to consider while preparing patent specifications' by Dr. Dinesh P Patil, Dy. Controller of Patents and Design, DPPIT, Ministry of commerce and industry.**

The speaker of the session is Dr. Dinesh P Patil, Dy. Controller of Patents and Design, DPPIT, Ministry of commerce and industry. He started out the lecture by explaining what invention is and the three important aspects of invention that are novelty, inventive step and industrial application. The solution to a problem that is provided by you should be protected and owned by you by either keeping it as a trade secret or getting a patent. Patent provides exclusive monopoly right for 20 years.

He explained in brief the process of patent. There are two types of patent specifications which include Provisional specification S (9) and Complete specifications (10). Claims define the scope of invention for which one is seeking protection so it is a very crucial part of patent application. An invention is nothing but a claim and those inventions ultimately become your patent. He explained the contents of patent specification which include the title of the invention, efficient instrument for the purpose of searching, and status of technology in the field of invention, objective of the invention, detailed summary of the invention, claims and then the summary of the invention.

He further explained the Scope of amendment. No amendments in complete specification is allowable, except by the way of disclaimer, correction or explanation. No amendments is allowable, except for incorporation of actual fact. There is a chance that during the pre-grant and post-grant if patent application is not sufficiently and clearly disclosing the invention or wrongly mentioning the source and geographical origin these can be the grounds for opposition.

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
